

## DeCandia to grow food for the needy at farm

Doug DeCandia of Lewisboro, the Food Bank of Westchester's food growing program coordinator, will cultivate a quarter-acre of Westchester Land Trust's Sugar Hill Farm property to grow produce for the Food Bank. The two organizations' recently held a formal groundbreaking for the Food Bank's New Garden, which will provide food — expected to be about 500 pounds — for needy residents of Westchester. All of the produce will be distributed by the Food Bank, which is based in Millwood.

Sugar Hill Farm will be the fifth location in the county on which the Food Bank is growing fresh produce.

Westchester Land Trust has successfully matched 12 farmers with 12 landowners as part of its Farmers Network, but this will be the first time one of the land trust's own properties will be part of the program.
